


SAILING INSTRUCTIONS Wanamaker Regatta



Hosted by Island Heights Yacht Club Saturday, June 16, 2018

1. RULES

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the current Racing Rules of Sailing.

2. ENTRIES

Competitors may enter online at IHYC.com click on sailing tab or by completing an entry form on-site and paying the entry fee to Island Heights Yacht Club between 9:30 am and 10:30 am on Saturday, June 16, 2018.

3. NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located adjacent to the Commodore's Room.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flagpole located on the south side (rear) of IHYC. If a postponement is signaled ashore, the warning signal will be made not less than one hour (1 hr) after the AP is lowered.

5. SCHEDULE


A competitors' meeting will be held at 10:45 am on Saturday, June 16, 2018 on the south side (rear) of the IHYC. The warning signal for the first race will be at 12:15 pm that same day. Subsequent races will be held as soon as possible after the end of the previous race. Three (3) races are planned, one (1) race will constitute a regatta.

6. CLASS FLAGS


River Course

7. RACING AREA

Wanamaker & River courses for all classes except E-Scows which will sail on the Seaside course

8. COURSES AND MARKS

The courses will be a windward leeward with an off-set at the windward mark and a leeward gate. The windward mark will be rounded to port. The offset mark will be a smaller round buoy. A placard will be displayed on the starting boat with a "1", "2" or "3" indicating the number of windward mark rounding's for each race. For final race A-Cats & Ensigns finish at IHYC must leave Long Point marker to starboard.

9. PENALTIES

Single-Turn Penalty.


10. STARTING AND FINISHING LINES

The starting and finishing lines will be between the orange flag on the signal boat and a round buoy placed to port. The final race for A-Cats & Ensigns will be finishing at IHYC between the orange flag at club dock and round buoy placed to port.


11. SAFETY

Each competitor is responsible to judge the skills and the quality of their crew and boat. The decision to participate in this event is solely the responsibility of the skipper of each boat. The Island Heights Yacht Club and any person or authority involved in the organization of this event, will not accept any liability for losses, damages, injuries or inconveniences that may happen to people or equipment, either on the ground, or at sea, as a result of their participation.

12. TIME LIMIT

The time limit for each race will be one hour (1 hr) for the first boat to finish. Boats finishing more than thirty minutes (30 min) after the first boat finishes will be scored DNF without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, 36.1, A4 and A5.

13. PROTESTS

Protests shall be delivered to the official notice board area within sixty minutes (60 min) after the race committee boat docks. The protest time limit and list of protests received will be posted on the notice board. Hearings will be held as soon as possible.

14. RADIO COMMUNICATION

The Wanamaker Race Committee will communicate on VHF 69. The River RC will communicate on VHF 70. The Seaside Race Committee will communicate on VHF 71. The RC will make an effort to call each boat involved in an individual recall, but is not obligated to do so.

15. SCORING

The low point scoring system will be used. All scores will count. This changes RRS A2.

16. TROPHIES

Awards will be presented to the top three finishers (participation allowing).
